

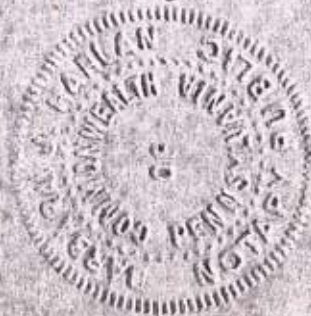

I, Peggy A. Rechel, 1017 Railway Street, Williamsport, PA, did hold a conversation with Duane F. Gleckner, then of 1110 Grove Street, Williamsport, PA, regarding the Jennifer Hill murder and the subsequent trial of Kim Hubbard. During that discussion, Duane Gleckner stated to me that he was positive there were two (2) sets of photographs showing the location of the body of Jennifer Hill in the corn field along Sylvan Dell Road and that these two sets of pictures showed the body in two different locations. Mr. Gleckner further stated that he felt the prosecution was trying to confuse himself and other witnesses with the two different sets of photos. He then further qualified that statement by saying that it could have been that the prosecution was, in fact, confused. Mr. Gleckner said that he was positive in his own mind about the location of the body. I asked him if he would be interested in talking to reporters who were writing an article concerning the trial and he replied that he would consider it. I then contacted former mayor John Coder and related the conversation to him so that he might inform Kim Hubbard's parents.

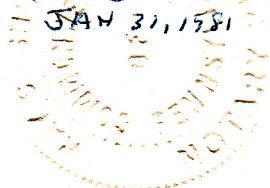
On the second occasion of observing said van, I was able to see the license plate which began with either the Letter "R" or Letter "S".




I, FRANK WELSH, being duly sworn according to law hereby deposes and says that the following facts are true and correct to the best of my knowledge, information, and belief.
